MONTHLY REPORT JULY 2008

July, with its many hot and humid days did not slow down the Public Works Department from their many assignments.

Work at LACP involved much of the daily tasks such as continuing the installation and completion of the water line and fountain at the Dog Park. They also sealed the cuts that were blacktopped where the water line was installed and seeded and strawed the area. Everyday maintenance of mowing, tilling up of the horseshoe pits, restroom cleaning and trash pick-up were also performed. Maintenance of the volleyball court and Fun Fort; weed pulling in the flower beds and repairing the front entrance gate were also accomplished. A new screen door was installed at the CPYSL Soccer office at the LACP Barn. Wood carpet was added to the Tot Lot play area and the nature trails and campsite areas were mowed and trimmed of overgrown vegetation. The lower pavilion was prepped for a concert and a tournament. Green safety markers were installed at the LACP crosswalk. Paver blocks were added at the concession area to make a small walkway to the Butterfly Garden.

General mowing of other parks and right of ways, ball field maintenance, vegetation control and weed pulling were performed at Wass Park and Yetter Field. Wood chippings were also added to areas at Wass Park. Top soil was leveled at Allendale's Creekwood Park.

Mowing was done at the Highway Building and right of ways. Work at the new township building consisted of hanging more pictures, painting lines at the police parking area, installing delineators, delivering yard waste and recycle bins and trimming the bushes at Beetle Bop. Water holes were filled with millings at the lot beside the township building and the plants around the building were also watered.

Lower Allen participated in the annual COG sale again this year. All items taken to the sale were successfully sold.

Wood mulching was completed from the huge pile of brush dropped off by township residents and the first five deliveries to township residents were started on July 31, and August 1. Three hundred, eighty-five loads (nine loads were from Shiremanstown residents) of brush were delivered during the month and 56 individuals (three from Shiremanstown) dropped off items for the Bulk/Metal dumpsters. The usual street sweeping, hot taping, tri-deck mowing, sign work and horizontal grinding were also performed.

Additional projects completed by Public Works for the months were:

- Trimming and street sweeping on Creekwood Drive.
- Blacktop patching on Valley Road.
- Storm inlet cleaning.
- Roadside mowing.
- Loaned barricades to Gold's Gym and Police Dept.
